- 1. The abstract of the research paper should clearly underline the aim, methodology, and findings of the research paper in 350-500 words.
- 2. The research paper should embody the results of original research and give ample evidence of scholarship, which should be creative, independent in character, and fundamental in nature.
- 3. The research paper should be neatly typed in 14 font size (New Times Roman) with 1.5 space and submitted in one soft copy at the email given: *chasscong2023@gmail.com*
- 4. All notes and references should come at the end of the paper.
- 5. The research paper should preferably contain 3000 to 5000 words along with an Abstract of 350 500 words. *It should also have at least four to six keywords.
- 6. The format should be in accordance with the latest APA seventh edition. Sample entry for work cited:
 - a. Books: E. Stuart. (1997). The Birth of Territory. The University of Chicago Press.
 - b. Articles: Bhatia, B. and Dreze, J. (2006) Employment Guarantee in Jharkhand: Grand Realities. Economic & Political Weekly, 41, pp. 319-202.
- 7. Graphs, Tables and Charts in MS Office (Word /Excel format Black and White) or equivalent format are preferred. Fonts for special characters be also provided.
- 8. A short biographical sketch of the author/s should accompany the research paper.
- 9. The author/s must give an undertaking that the paper has not been published wholly or partly, in any other journal, and that it has not been submitted to any other journal for consideration for publication.
- 10. All research papers submitted for publication shall be used, subject to the positive reports from neutral and objective experts in relevant fields of specialization.

- 12. All the timely submitted and selected research papers, duly approved the experts after blind review will be published in a Journal or in an edited Book.
